

Deer Resistant Plants

There is nothing more frustrating than watching deer dine on your landscaping. To make matters worse, deer are creatures of habit. Once they discover your garden, they will visit regularly. Males can also cause damage by rubbing their antlers along the stems or trunks of trees, stripping off the bark.

To control the problem, deer need to be discouraged as soon as they first appear. The first option is to physically restrict deer by enclosing your entire yard or garden with fencing at least six feet tall. If you only wish to protect a few trees or shrubs, you can use barrier fencing around these plants. The second option is using a repellant. Hinsdale Nurseries carries a very effective product called Liquid Fence.

If neither option is for you, you can always choose plants that are recommended as deer resistant. Deer usually stay away from plants that are poisonous, have strong aromas, or have coarse, fuzzy, bristly or spiny textures. Deer also tend to stay away from daffodils, but love eating tulips. When shopping for bulbs, look for mixes that are labeled Deer Resistant. Below is a list of Hinsdale Nurseries recommended Deer Resistant Plants.
