

Bee Friendly

Bees have a huge impact on our food supply as they pollinate farmers' fields. Without bees, we would not have food. With the widespread use of pesticides and loss of habitat threatening their survival, bee populations can use a little help from the home gardener. You can create a bee-friendly environment by doing a few of these simple things:

- **Feed the bees.** Include plants that provide nectar and pollen. The list below includes some of our favorite bee-friendly plants.
- **Be chemical-free.** Any pesticides used in your yard to eliminate the bad bugs, may be hurting the good guys. Plants under stress are more likely to be attacked by insects, so keeping plants healthy will lessen the need for chemical control. Always plant the right plant in the right spot!
- Vary bloom times. Including plants that flower in succession from spring to fall, will keep bees happy
 through the year. With the food they collect, they will have enough honey in the hive to keep them alive
 through the cold, winter months.
- *Incorporate simple flowers.* Double blooms, with all those petals, can be very showy, but are generally not as nectar-rich. It is easier for bees to reach the inner flower parts of those less frilly, single blooms.
- **Provide a drink of water.** Adding some pebbles to a birdbath or shallow water bowl, allows bees to land safely while getting some fresh water.
